The Bible - What it is

- "This is not a history, science, or geography book. While all those are in here, this is a book of truths."

The Bible - What it is

- Genesis 1:1-25
 - All of Creation, the entire universe
- Genesis 1:26 Revelation 22:21
 - Man's relationship to God and to each Other
- The OT is mainly concerned with Israel
 - Always the nation



Old Testament Origins

- Tanakh (TaNaKh) (OT Canon: 450 BC according to Talmud)
 - O Torah = Law
 - Nevi'im = Prophets
 - Ketuvi'im = Writings
- Septuagint (Quoted by Jesus and NT writers; 4th 3rd century BC)
 - LXX or "The Seventy"
- Masoretic Text (Our text for OT translations; 7th 10th century AD)
 - Masoretes
 - First version with vowels added
- Dead Sea Scrolls (3rd century BC to 1st century AD)
 - Found post WWII
 - Great Isaiah Scroll



Tanakh

- 24 Books in Tanakh (same as our 39 books)
- Torah = 5 Books of Moses (same as us)
- Nevi'im = 8 Books but we count 21:
 - 1, 2 Samuel = Samuel
 - 0 1, 2 Kings = Kings
 - All 12 Minor Prophets = One book
- Ketuvi'im = 11 Books but we count 13
 - Ezra and Nehemiah are one book
 - 1, 2 Chronicles = Chronicles



Tanakh

- "Whoever brings together in his house more than twenty-four books brings confusion."
 - Midrash (Commentary) Kohelet (Ecclesiastes) 12:12
- Apocrypha or Deuterocanonical
 - Intertestamental Period (400 BC 100 AD)
 - Second in canonical order



The Prophets

Major Prophets (3)

- Isaiah = 66 chapters
- Ezekiel = 48 chapters
- Jeremiah = 52 chapters

Minor Prophets (12)

- Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum,
 Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi
- All of these books have 14 or less chapters each



The Prophets

- What is a Prophet? What is Prophecy?
- The prophet's burden was to proclaim judgement on their own people, people they loved.
- The prophet's number one duty was to instruct the people to live morally and upright (righteous) lives.
- Miracles or fulfilled prophecies were "calling cards" of the prophet; they were the prophet's credentials.
- As such, prophetic books were written for the benefit of the current audience of the time.
- Prophecies were usually fulfilled within the prophet's lifetime.
- God can and does speak farther into the future via prophets.



Isaiah

- "In the year that King Uzziah died..." Is 6:1
 - Uzziah died in 740 BC
- "Who says of Cyrus 'He is my shepherd" Is 44:28
 - Persian King Cyrus released Israel in 539 BC
- Isaiah "School"
 - First Isaiah = Chapter 1-39 (8th century BC)
 - Second Isaiah = Chapters 40-55 (6th century BC)
 - Third Isaiah = Chapters 56-66 (5th/4th century BC)



The Writings

- Psalms, Proverbs and Job
 - 3 distinct books but always presented together
 - Hebrew "emet" which means "Truth"
- Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, and Esther
 - Five different scrolls
- Daniel
 - Considered apocalyptic revealing of hidden things
 - Prophecy of history together with eschatology
- Ezra-Nehemiah and 1, 2 Chronicles considered histories
