- In relation to Jesus' ministry, do world events leading up to his time matter?
- If they mattered then, with respect to God's mission, do world events matter now?



Malachi

- Written in 430 BC
- Israel, the nation, had again turned from the LORD
 - Malachi's prophecy was one of repentance
- Malachi prophesied of:
 - A messenger to prepare the way (3:1)
 - The return of Elijah (4:5 and Luke 1:17)
 - John the Baptist's response (John 1:19-23)



• Alexander the Great:

- ~330 BC
- Greek Language

Antiochus IV Epiphanes

- Dec 167 Dec 164 BC
- Pagan statue Zeus) and pigs in the Temple
- Judas Maccabaeus led a revolt
- Dec 164 rescinded, allowed Jews to worship
- Hanukkah: Rededicate the Temple, Oil miracle



Pompey

- Roman General
- Occupied Jerusalem in 63 BC
- Entered the Holy of Holies

Julius Caesar

- Friend of Jews
- Emperor 49-44 BC
- Assigned Antipater as praefectus/procurator of Judaea
- Assassinated March 15, 44 BC (Ides of March)



• Antipater

- Rescued Caesar in Alexandria
- Caesar made him a Roman Citizen
- Prefect/Procurator of Judaea
- Had two sons Phasael and Herod (The Great)

Octavian and Antony

- Co-ruled Rome
- Antony teamed up with Cleopatra of Egypt
- Octavian achieved the "Pax Romana"
- Handed Republic back to Senate and People (kind of)
- Changed name to Augustus



Herod The Great

- Ruled for 33 years (37 4 BC)
- Good friend of Marcus Agrippa, Augustus' son-in-law
- Fantastic Builder cities, Temple expansion
- Caesarea took 12 years, artificial port
- Temple 1000 Levites trained, services continued
- Temple Stage One 10 years, finished 63 AD
- Tried to be a Jew, but built pagan temples
- Declared "King of the Jews" by Senate in 40 BC



Herod The Great

- 3 wives, many sons, many "deaths"
- Split territory into 3
- Antipas (Galilee), Philip (North), Archelaus (Judaea)
- Antipas (Herod) 42 years; Philip 37 years
- Archelaus Really bad, removed by Augustus in 6 AD
- 6 AD Judaea became a Roman Province
- Roman garrison and prefect installed
- Died March of 4 BC (Matthew 2:16)



New Testament Dates

- 6 4 BC: Birth Of Jesus
- 30 or 33 AD: Jesus' crucifixion, resurrection, ascension
- 50s to Early 60s: Letters of Paul
- Late 60s to Mid 90s: Gospels and Acts
- 90s: Letters of John and Revelation



New Testament Authors

- Matthew and Mark did not sign their gospels
- Luke and John signed their gospels
- Paul wrote his letters (probably...)
- Hebrews and Jude are unknown
- James is the brother of Jesus
- 1, 2, 3 John and Revelation from the Apostle John



Purpose

• Gospels:

- Tell Jesus' story
- \circ 1/3rd of them focus on his passion

• Letters:

- Occasional in nature
- Written in response or for a specific reason

• Acts:

• History of the early church

• Revelation:

- About Jesus
- Jesus wins!



Extrabiblical Writings

- Clement of Rome: Bishop of Rome, died 99 AD
- Polycarp: Last man alive discipled by an Apostle
- Ireaneus: Knew Polycarp, early theologian
- Ignatius: Roles of Bishops, Sacraments, ecclesiology
- Tertullian: Coined the term Trinitas
- Origen: 2000 works! First Principles and Hexapla



Historical Writings

Neronian Persecution

- Written by Tacitus in 64
- Pg. 1 of "Documents of the Christian Church"

Pliny (the Younger) and Emperor Trajan's exchange

- Written by Pliny and Trajan in 112
- Pg. 4 of "Documents of the Christian Church"
